Bimini Islands, The Bahamas

The Biminis is the area where Florida's Gulf Stream meets the Bahama Banks. It's home to some of the finest fishing in the Bahamas with championship tournaments, held year round. The tiny Biminis, made up of three major islands --

North, South and East Bimini, is situated 40 miles (80km) off the coast of Florida is the quaint island of North Bimini. The South islands cover the largest area of the Biminis with an overall length of four miles; averaging a one mile width. The area has a diverse geology going from a limestone ridge in the southwest to being very sandy at the northwestern tip. Settled in the early 1920s, when American alcohol prohibition took effect, Bimini served as a base of operations for Nassau rumrunners. As a result, the Bimini economy prospered. The islands were especially noted when famed author Ernest Hemingway lived there from 1935 to 1937. Bimini, today, is rich with history, natural resources and a popular allure as a tropical vacation spot.
