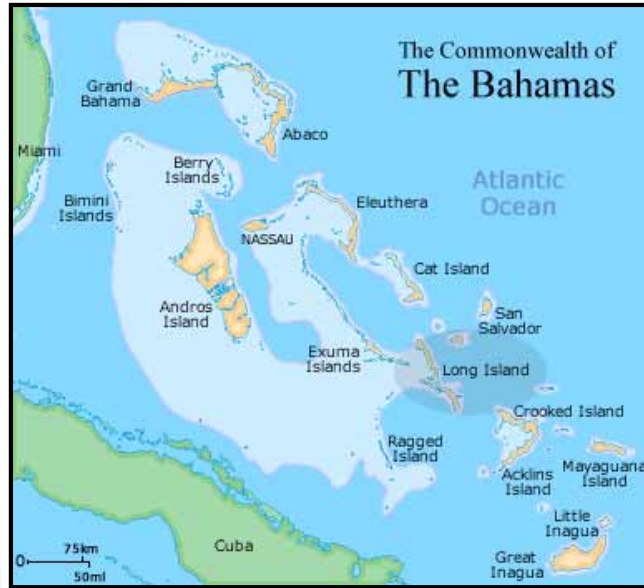

Long Island, The Bahamas

Long Island was the third island discovered by Christopher Columbus in 1492. In his diary, Columbus described Long Island as the most beautiful island he had ever seen. Perhaps as a result, a monument to Christopher Columbus is erected on the white bluffs of the north end of the island. Long Island is 80 miles long but no more than four miles at its widest point. The island has some of the most beautiful beaches in the Bahamas and provides excellent sites for diving and snorkeling. Clarence Town is the capital of Long Island and has a population of approximately 350 people. It has a marina, two restaurants as well as the government dock where the mail boat docks on a weekly basis. It also has a small grocery store, gas station and a small pub as well as a police station, post office and community centre. The island is divided by the Tropic of Cancer and is bordered by two entirely different coasts; one with rocky cliffs and caves that dip suddenly into the sea and the other has broad expansive beaches. Sloping hills characterize the northeast while low hillsides make up the island's southern end. This range of physical appearance is why Long Island is considered one of the most picturesque islands in the Bahamas.
