Spanish Wells, The Bahamas

A short water taxi ride from North Eleuthera is Spanish Wells, a beautiful fishing village set among groves of palms and trees. The Spanish conquistadors first put Spanish Wells on the map when, in the 17th Century, they sunk a well there to provide their ships with potable water. The island was designated as the final landing point for their galleons before attempting the arduous journey back to Spain. Spanish Wells was first inhabited in 1649. Loyalists from Carolina, escaping the American Revolution, came and settled in 1776. For centuries the industrious residents made their living from the bountiful miles of deep blue sea around the island. In fact, this small community provides 75% of all the crawfish caught in the Bahamas during season. The islanders also make excellent fishing guides and diving instructors. Those who are not employed in the fishing industry are involved in farming and fruit growing.
